Our Week at a Glance

Religion –Stories we read this week include Zechariah and Elizabeth, the Angel Gabriel appearing to Mary, the birth of John, and the birth of Jesus. Before our vacation begins, the children will learn about the shepherds' visit to Jesus. We are learning about the Jesse tree and celebrated our Lady of Guadalupe's feast day. The celebration of Advent is always in our hearts.

Math – We wrapped up chapter 7: Representing and Reading Numbers 6-12. Your children have learned to model, count, draw, write, and read numbers 6-12. This week we focused on the numbers 11 and 12, and reviewed for the test. Please continue to practice all numbers learned so far to ensure your children are writing them properly, Christmas break is a great time to practice if you are looking for a way to keep your child busy!

Reading - This week we continued with Tic, Tac and Toc! Your children listened to these three girls sing a song about tumbling on a trampoline, tootling a tuba, tossing tangerines, and other activities whose names start with the letter t. In this unit, we learned to name and write upper and lowercase Tt. We listened for the sound of t at the beginning and the end of words such as tag and dot. We practiced reading words that differ only by their middle vowels, such as dig and dog. This unit also contains a story about playing tag that your child can read to you! When they bring it home, turn to pages 10-11 and have your child read the story to you. Discuss what you both like or dislike about playing tag. To conclude the unit on Monday, we will listen to a story titled Tac, Toc, and Turtles. In this story, Tac and Toc pretend to be turtles. Toc gets jealous when Tac invites Cass to play the game, but Toc soon realizes that including others is more fun than staying angry. Discuss with your child the importance of sharing and inviting others to join in games.

Science/Social Studies – We continue to talk about Christmas customs across the world. We illustrated our own Nativity booklets. These are beautiful books to read together before bed.
